Annual Water Irrigation Schedule Returns

With the hottest months and the biggest demands on everyone's water supply just ahead, we are commencing our annual two days per week lawn and garden irrigation schedule in 18 towns.

This year's mandatory program runs through October 31 for Darien, East Granby, Easton, Fairfield, Granby, Greenwich, Groton, Mystic, New Canaan, Newtown, Ridgefield, Simsbury, Stamford, Stonington, Trumbull, Weston, Westport and Wilton.

Why focus on outdoor watering? Up to half the water used outside is wasted. Leaky

or incorrectly programmed lawn irrigation systems account for much of that, along with overwatering.

This program has already saved billions of gallons of water for homes and businesses across Connecticut. A bonus: It has actually helped our customers make their lawns and gardens more resistant to the droughts.

Will droughts be back this summer? No one knows, but water is a finite resource. Avoiding waste is important no matter the weather. For more on the program, including how to apply for a variance, visit aquarionwater.com/watering.
