Water Conservation Program Returns

With Massachusetts' hottest months and the biggest demands on local water supplies just ahead, we're again scheduling nonessential outdoor water use in several towns to reduce water waste.

Designed to comply with requirements of the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection, the schedules are mandatory and apply to customers in Dover, Ponds of Plymouth, Pinehills and Millbury. The schedules will remain in effect through September 30.

Why focus on outdoor water use? Up to half the water used outside is wasted. Leaky or incorrectly programmed lawn irrigation systems account for much of that, along with overwatering.

Your home's schedule depends on the last digit of your street number and which water system you are connected

to. See the schedules below or visit aquarionwater.com/watering for addition details.
