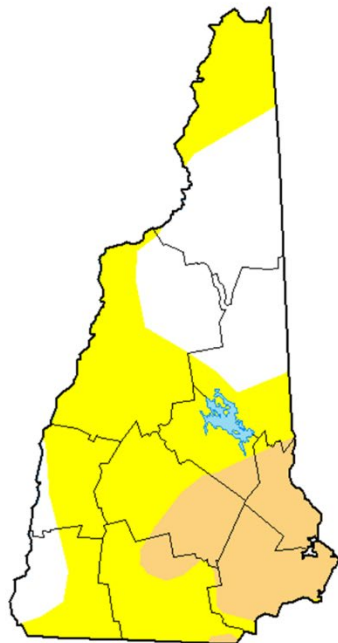
Weather Trends/Outlook

Rainfall in August was less than normal (1.8 inches compared to an average of 3.6 inches). The area has returned to Abnormally Dry conditions (see the U.S. Drought Monitor map below).

No water use restrictions are currently in place yet residents are encouraged to use water conservatively. Less demand over the winter will help local aquifers recharge thereby lowering the probability of water use restrictions later this spring and summer.
