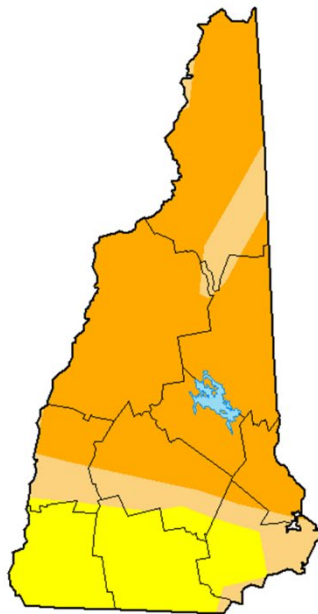
Weather Trends/Outlook

December was another drier than normal month; only 3.4 inches compared to an average of 4.1 inches. Overall drought conditions continue to remain in a Severe Drought condition (see the U.S. Drought Monitor map below).







Through the winter season, there are no water use restrictions currently in place for Abenaki's customers yet residents are encouraged to use water conservatively. Less demand over the winter will help local aquifers recharge thereby lowering the probability of water use restrictions next spring and summer.
