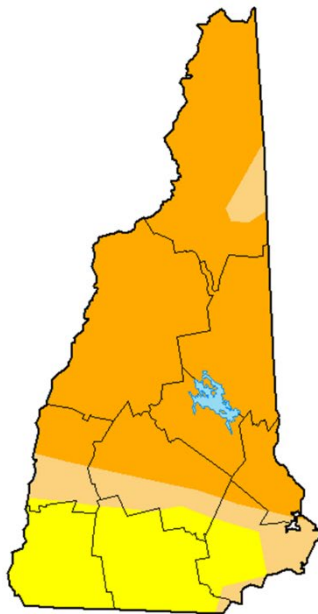
### *Weather Trends/Outlook*

November was another drier than normal month; only 1.8 inches compared to an average of 3.6 inches. Overall drought conditions improved slightly yet the region remains in a Severe Drought condition (see the U.S. Drought Monitor map below).







There are no water use restrictions currently in place for Abenaki's customers yet residents are encouraged to use water conservatively. Less demand over the winter will help local aquifers recharge thereby lowering the probability of water use restrictions next spring and summer.
