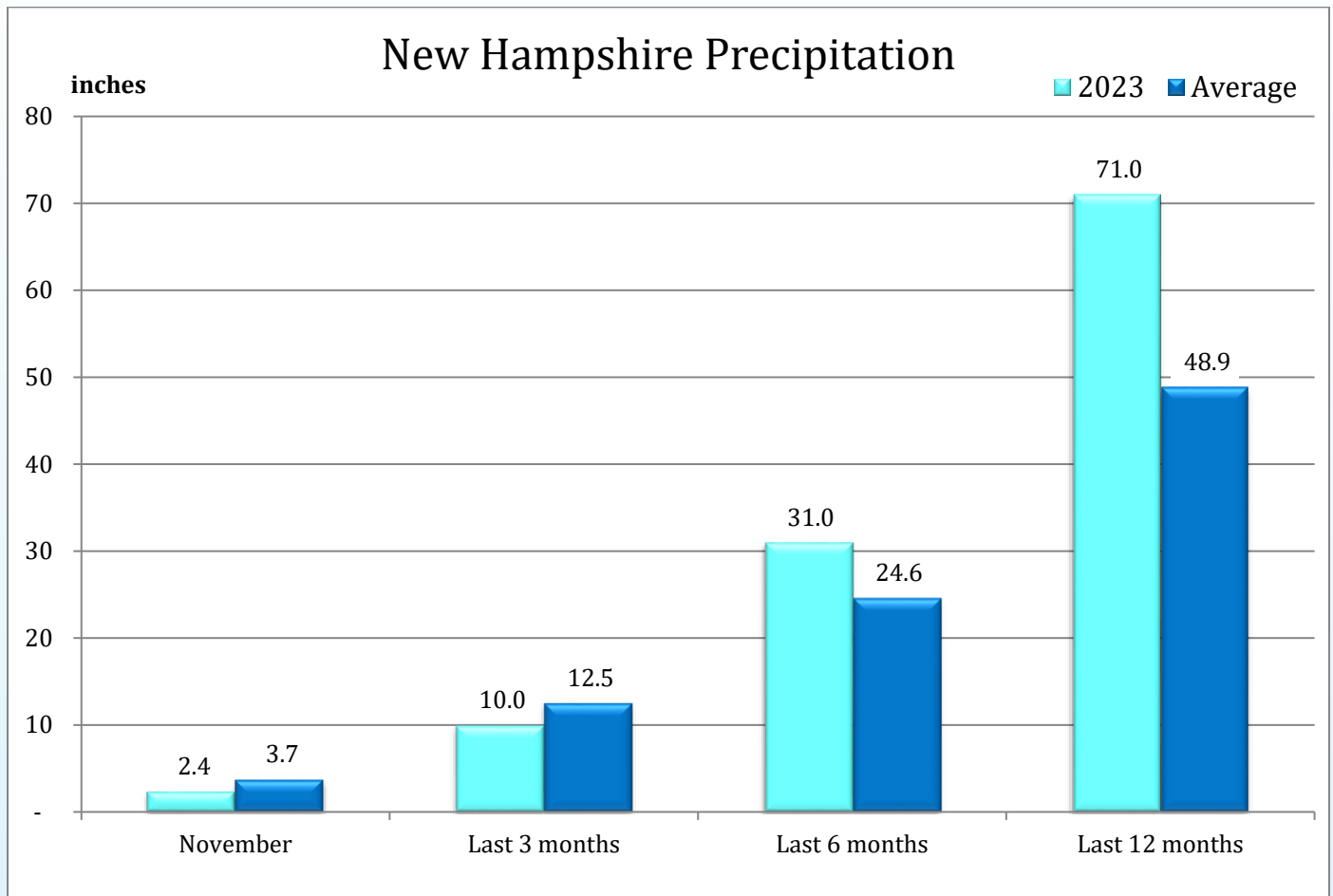


Water Supply Update

Weather Trends/Outlook

Rainfall in November was 2.7 inches; about 2/3rds of the long-term average of 3.7 inches. There are no current drought conditions (see the U.S. Drought Monitor map below) due to higher than average precipitation over the past year.
