

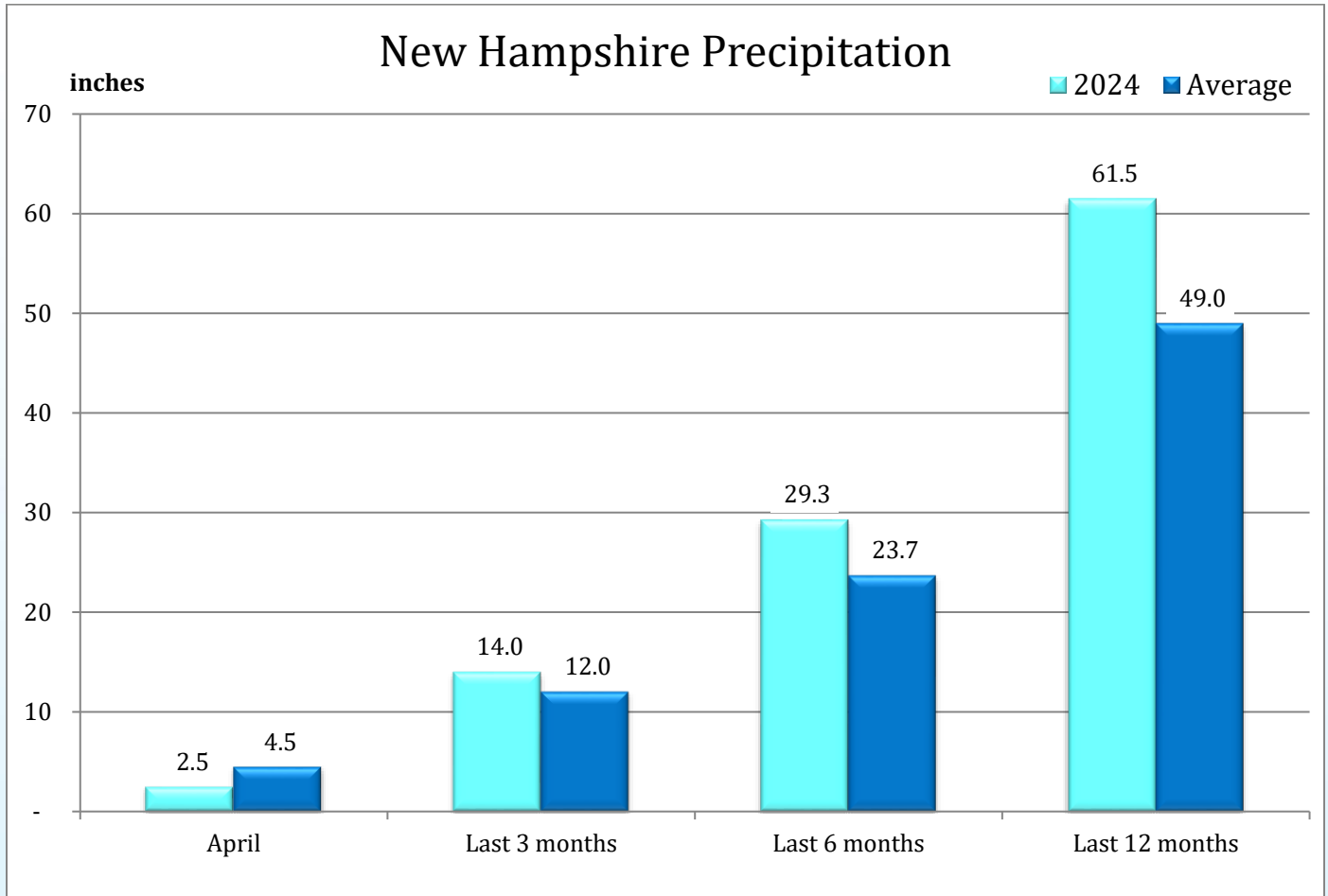


Water Supply Update

Weather Trends/Outlook

Precipitation this month was drier than normal; 2.5 inches compared to 4.5 inches on average. Longer term precipitation remains higher than average and there are no current drought conditions (see the U.S. Drought Monitor map below).











U.S. Drought Monitor New Hampshire
