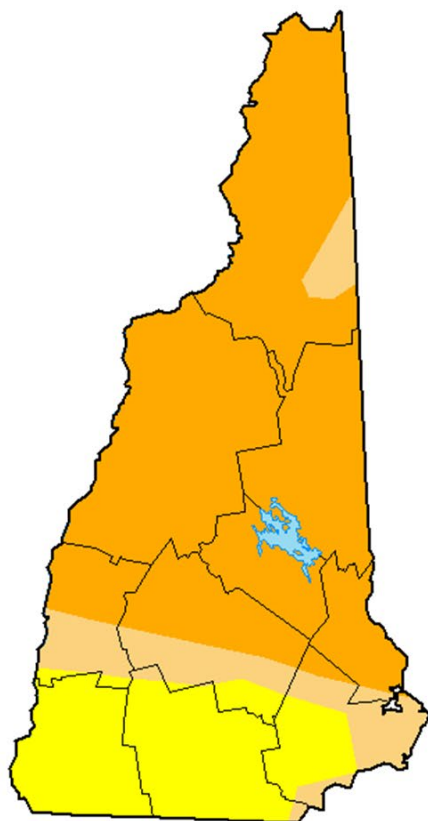
Weather Trends/Outlook

November was drier than normal; only 1.7 inches compared to 4.0 inches on average. The seacoast remains in a Moderate Drought condition (see the U.S. Drought Monitor map below).







With the growing season ending, water use restrictions are no longer in effect for Aquarion customers yet residents are encouraged to use water conservatively. Less demand over the winter will help local aquifers recharge thereby lowering the probability of water use restrictions next spring and summer.
